A word from our Director of Golf...


Happy August!

A word from our Superintendent of Grounds...

With plenty of the golf season still to come, we hope everyone has been enjoying the golf course. Mother Nature was not very kind to us to start the season, but has rebounded nicely and gave us a nice July for golf. Let's hope the weather will stay nice long enough to take us into November. The grounds staff has been hard at work to help make your experience an enjoyable one each and every time you come to Diamond Hawk. I must commend them on all their time and effort. We hope you have enjoyed the course conditions so far this season.



I'd also like to take this time to remind everyone of proper course etiquette. I will briefly touch on three key issues that impact the golf course and will probably impact your round as well. These issues are: **1) cart etiquette, 2) divot repair/ replacement and 3) ball mark repair.**

Please follow the cart rule for the day, please keep out of the fescue native areas and keep carts on the paths when you reach the "no carts" signs. If you play golf, you will make a divot. Repairing your divot ensures that the golfers who follow you have the same level playing surface you had when you started your round. Also, the void created when you take the divot will heal much faster when it's repaired as soon as possible. Ball marks can ruin a good putting surface. As a general rule, a ball mark repaired within 10 minutes will heal within two to three days. An unrepaired ball mark may take as long as three weeks to heal. It's the responsibility of every golfer to repair your own ball mark. ***This is appreciated by all!!***

Enjoy the rest of the golf season and we'll see you on the course.
